ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING QUARTERLY MEETING: January 5, 2024 Special Meeting

Welcome:

Russ welcomed everyone and reviewed the mission of the council.

Review and Approval of Minutes:

The September 15, 2023 meeting minutes were approved unanimously.

Old Business:

The following items were discussed as possible goals for 2024:

- 1. Review council bylaws and make changes in accordance with the Sunshine Act
- 2. Recruitment of new members
- 3. Correct interpreters for press conferences
- 4. More transparency with community; need to know what community needs and that will drive council.
- 5. Wait until the survey results and use that information for goals.
- 6. Specific time after ACDHH meetings for community to connect with ODHH.
 - a. This would be different from public time in which it would be open dialogue for the council and ODHH to talk with the community.
 - b. Having specific time and dates would allow for consistency rather than random town hall meeting.

New Business:

- 1. Survey Letter
 - a. The survey letter draft was discussed, reviewed and approved unanimously. Some changes made included:
 - i. Shortening some of the sentences that seemed to reiterate similar information.
 - ii. Adding consistent capitalization such as D and B in DeafBlind.
 - iii. Adding a blurb about what to do if needing assistance on filling out the survey.
 - iv. Adding that this survey is for people from Pennsylvania.
 - v. Adding a deadline for how long the survey will be available.
 - b. The letter and survey will be sent out to community members by council. The deadline for the survey will be 90 days April 14.
- 2. The March meeting will have a presentation on the Sunshine Act. A committee will be developed to revise the bylaws for approval at the June meeting.

Public Comment:
