**About the Organization**: The Pennsylvania Department of Corrections is responsible for overseeing the operation of:

- 26 state correctional institutions, including one motivational boot camp
- 14 community corrections centers and contracts with almost 50 contract facilities
- A Training Academy, located in Elizabethtown, PA
- Approximately 15,000 employees and roughly 46,000 inmates

It is important to note that DOC does NOT oversee county prisons; it is also important to note that parole is governed by the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole, a separate entity.

## **Workforce Services for Inmates:**

- All inmates are TABE tested upon incarceration
- Any inmates without a GED/high school diploma or equivalent is required to attend 300 hours of academic programming.
- Inmates may enroll in vocational courses; course offerings vary depending on prison
- Work opportunities exist through inmate employment and through Correction Industries
- 12 institutions currently have Transitional Housing Units, or THUs, to assist inmates in reentry. Additional reentry workshops, including resume assistance, are offered through the THUs

## **Services for the Business Community/Referrals:**

The Bureau of Community Corrections, part of DOC, administers the Re-entry Services Invitation to Qualify contract, which includes workforce development as one of its 11 Re-entry service lots. Reentrants from DOC facilities are referred to these providers for services that are fully funded by the DOC. The BCC has also worked to have a staff member at each site trained in Offender Workforce Development Specialist (OWDS) and Retention Employment Specialist (RES) to further assist reentrants in employment opportunities.
